
Working with Money

These worksheets will help you...

- become more confident when dealing with money.
- check that you have been given the correct change in shops.
- make good use of supermarket leaflets and work out the costs when buying more than one of an item.





You will need...

◆ A current "Special Offers" leaflet from your local supermarket. For example Somerfield, Asda, Tescos, Sainsbury or Budgens.

Other useful aids...

Adult Numeracy. Levels E1 / E2

Measures, shape and space - Common Measures. MSS1/E1.1 Recognise and select coins and notes. MSS1/E2.1. Make up amounts of money to £1 in different ways using 1p, 2p, 5, 10p, 20p and 50p coins. MSS1/E2.2. Calculate the cost of more than one item and the change from the transaction, in pence or in whole pounds.

- 1) How many ways can you make up a pound?
- ♦ For example:
 - a) 2×50 p pieces = £1.00
 - b) 5 x 10p pieces and 1 x 50p piece = £1.00

There are lots of other ways of making up a £1.00. See how many you can find. You may find it helpful to use real money, money cards or sketch quick pictures.

2) Supermarket Bargains. How many items can you buy for £1?

Have a look through a recent "Special Offers" leaflet from your local supermarket. Do you see any bargains? If you don't have a leaflet - use the one on page 5.



- ♦ You have £1.
- ♦ What could you buy and how much change would get if you gave the cashier a £1 coin?
- a) Idea 1. You could buy a box of Shredded Wheat (99p). You would get 1p change.
- b) Idea 2. You could buy some bread rolls. The soft bake baguettes are only 49p for a pack of 4 so we could by two packs. This would cost $2 \times 49p = 98p$. So we would get 2p change.
